



## VOCABULARY SCOPE AND SEQUENCE

Below is a list of key vocabulary words that appear in the Phonics Launch texts. Glossary and Vocabulary Words are listed next to each title. Some of the words are defined within the text; these may be left as opportunities for students to use vocabulary strategies to define during reading.

**Before:** Consider introducing three to five of these or other words prior to reading using the following procedure:

1. Provide a student-friendly definition.
2. Connect the word to something students already know.
3. Define how the word is used in the text.
4. Have students turn to a partner and use the word in a sentence and/or give examples of the word.

When determining which words to introduce, consider students' background knowledge, experiences, and oral vocabulary.

**During:** Additionally, on Days 3 and 4, opportunities for review and further interaction with the vocabulary are embedded within the lesson.

**After:** Graphic organizers are provided to support students' continued vocabulary development following the lessons. These may be used during centers or independent work time.
