

## Reading Prompts

Goal	Suggested Prompts
Concepts of Print	<ul> <li>Where do we start reading?</li> <li>Where do I go next?</li> <li>Point to each word as you read. Can you make it match?</li> <li>How many letters are in the word?</li> <li>Show me one letter. Show me two.</li> </ul>
Using Letters	<ul> <li>Can you name a letter on this page?</li> <li>I see a letter(s) that makes the sound(s). Can you find it?</li> <li>How do we start this word? What is the first sound?</li> </ul>
Self-Monitoring	<ul> <li>You stopped reading. What did you notice?</li> <li>Something was tricky. Can you find it?</li> <li>Are you right?</li> <li>Did that look right?</li> <li>Run your finger under the word as you say the sounds.</li> <li>Reread and check the beginning (middle, end) of the word.</li> </ul>
Decoding	<ul> <li>What can you do to help yourself?</li> <li>Something wasn't quite right. Try that again and look carefully.</li> <li>Stretch the sounds and then blend them together to read the word.</li> <li>Do you know a word like that?</li> <li>Look for a part you know.</li> <li>Make the first sounds. Now say more.</li> <li>Can you break the word into parts?</li> <li>Show yourself the first part (last part).</li> <li>Try a different vowel sound.</li> </ul>
Comprehension	<ul> <li>What do you think will happen next?</li> <li>Have you ever felt like the character?</li> <li>How did the character's feelings change? Why?</li> <li>What happened in the story?</li> <li>What was the problem in the story?</li> <li>What did you learn?</li> <li>What do you think the author's message is?</li> <li>How did the illustrations help you understand the story?</li> </ul>
Vocabulary	<ul> <li>What does this word mean? How did you figure it out?</li> <li>Reread and think about the story.</li> <li>Use the glossary.</li> <li>How did the illustrations help you understand the meaning of that word?</li> </ul>
Fluency	<ul> <li>Can you read it more quickly?</li> <li>How do you sound?</li> <li>Reread that and sound like the character.</li> <li>Can you make it sound interesting?</li> </ul>
